

## Font Problems with the Chem 103/104 Web Sites

Most of the documents posted on my Chem 103/104 web sites are Adobe Acrobat PDF files produced from WordPerfect documents. WordPerfect has an extensive library of special fonts, which make it easy to insert characters such as Greek letters, mathematical symbols, foreign language symbols, iconic symbols, and typographical characters. If you have WordPerfect installed on your computer (e.g., many current Dell computers come with WordPerfect), you will be able to view and print these special characters without any problems. However, if your computer only has Microsoft Word, it will not have these special characters and will attempt to provide a substitute. In most cases, the substitute is nonsensical. The fix for this problem is fairly straightforward: just install WordPerfect. You can download a free trial edition of WordPerfect from Corel's web site, [www.corel.com](http://www.corel.com). Follow the link for Free Trials, and download WordPerfect Office 12 Trial Edition. Even if you allow the free trial to expire, your machine should still have the special fonts. Then, when Adobe Reader encounters one of these characters it will be able to find, display, and print it on your machine. If all else fails, I can loan you a disk with the fonts, which you can install using the procedure described in Windows Help.
